

Religious Education Policy Bunscoil Gleann Sidheáin, Cappoquin



MISSION STATEMENT

Bunscoil Gleann Sidheain places the child and his/her best interests at the heart of our educational philosophy. In our school we endeavour to create a caring community where management, staff, parents and pupils respect, value and appreciate each other. We actively promote a happy, healthy and stimulating school environment where opportunities are provided for promoting the full and harmonious development of all aspects of the person of the pupil; intellectual, physical, cultural, moral, emotional and spiritual. Every opportunity will be given to enable children to discover their talents and uniqueness and to develop into responsible and caring adults.

Introduction

Bunscoil Gleann Sidheáin is a Catholic school under the patronage of the Bishop Alphonsus Cullinan. The school also has two special classes for pupils with A.S.D. The school models and promotes a philosophy inspired by belief in God and traditional Catholic values. We promote religious education for the pupils in accordance with the doctrines, practices and ethos of the Catholic Church.

Rationale

This policy has been implemented to co-ordinate and consolidate religious education and to accommodate the enrolment of increased numbers of children of other faiths into the school community over the coming years.

Relationship to school ethos

This school enrols pupils of other faiths or no faith in the school, subject to the enrolment criteria, and respects their beliefs and practices in accordance with the school ethos of inclusivity.

School Procedures

Every child is welcome into the school having satisfied enrolment procedures, but the school cannot undertake to educate children of other faiths in their own faith. Arrangements are made within each class to accommodate children who do not take part in the religious education programme.

The Board of Management and teachers have adopted the Grow in Love Programme approved and recommended by the Irish Hierarchy for use in Catholic schools. The programme is taught to each class and will be implemented in 6th class as soon as it is in place. Pupils from the A.S.D. unit integrate with 2nd and 6th class for religion.

The following feasts and ceremonies are also observed:-

- Christmas crib and tree, Christmas Stories, Carol services, visit to local nursing homes to entertain patients.
- Annual talk for parents of 2nd class preparing for Sacrament of First penance and first Holy Communion by Primary Diocesan Advisor.
- Feast of St. Brigid making traditional crosses.
- Feast of St. Patrick depiction of story and shamrock, St. Patrick's Day Cards, school choir sings at St. Patrick's Day Mass.
- Lent Symbols of repentance, visit of local clergy to school to school to distribute ashes –Pupils in Senior classes attend Parish Mass.
- Easter Easter cards, story of the death of Jesus and resurrection, artwork and workbooks.
- Observance of Holy Days of Obligation.
- Celebration of the opening of school year with school mass.
- End of year School Mass for 6th class and their parents.
- Parents & Pupils of 2nd Class participate in the "Do this in Memory" programme facilitated by members of the Parish Council.

Liturgical Celebrations

The school celebrates the sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion. Children receive the sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion in St.Mary's Church.

Children are prepared thoroughly in all aspects of these sacraments by the individual class teachers in keeping with the Catholic ethos of the school.

Catholic Schools Week

Catholic Schools Week is observed each year. 5th Class pupils and teachers host Grandparents Day.

Teacher Input

In this school the following areas are covered.

- Sacred Space in Entrance Hall

- School Choir participate in Liturgies at Mass on Christmas Day and St. Patrick's Day.
